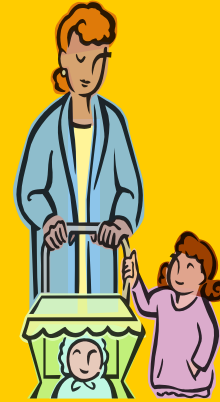

### What is WIC?

WIC is a supplemental food, nutrition, and education program. Clients are seen every 3 months at the clinic for education class or clinic visit. In return they receive breast feeding support, formula, and/or food which includes milk, cheese, eggs, peanut butter or beans, cereal, and juice.

### Who is this for?

This program is for women, who are pregnant, breastfeeding or postpartum, and children up to the age of five that meet financial guidelines and nutritional need.

- Proof of income (either a current Medical Card or pay stub)
- Identification (driver's license, birth certificate or crib card)

And

- Proof of residency (utility bill or other mail recently received at current address).
