Learner Objectives:
List the leading causes of emergency room visits by children in Stark County in 2009. Identify Safe Kids Stark County's programs, specifically sports related activities.

Identify mechanics of the overhead throwing athlete. Identify mechanical deficits predisposing overhead throwing athletes to injury.

Speakers

Dr. James (J.T.) Eckner graduated from Case Western Reserve University's School of Medicine in 2003 and completed his residency training in PM&R at the University of Michigan in 2007. Since that time he has held a faculty position in the UM Department of PM&R and is also a member of Michigan NeuroSport. As a junior faculty member, he also earned a Master of Science degree in 2009 from the University of Michigan in Clinical Research Design and Statistical Analysis through the UM On Job-On Campus Master of Science Program. His area of research interest is mild traumatic brain injury, with a particular emphasis on mTBI, or concussion, in athletes. He has conducted work under the mentorship of Drs James K. Richardson in the Department of PM&R and James A. Ashton-Miller in the Department of Mechanical Engineering aimed at developing better sideline tests for diagnosing and managing sport-related concussions, specifically through the assessment of reaction time.

Denise Roadman, a Licensed Athletic Trainer, is currently employed as an athletic trainer at Aultman North. Serves as the athletic trainer for East Canton High School. Serves as pitching instructor for John Carroll University. Served as athletic trainer for Team Canada at the Junior World Football Championships held in Canton in July 2009.

Amanda Kelly has been the Coordinator of Safe Kids Stark County since 2001. She serves as a Health Educator in the Injury Prevention Program at the Stark County Health Department. Amanda was awarded the 2005 Outstanding US Coalition Coordinator by Safe Kids Worldwide.
